


Staff Introductions - Mrs. Freeman

Elementary Progress Report

- Achievement Grade

The progress report reflects the student's current level of understanding and demonstration of knowledge and skills.



Elementary Progress Report

- Focus is on developing mastery over time
- Indicates where a student is at the end of the quarter
- Grades are <u>not</u> averaged -- they are used to identify the FREQUENCY with which student demonstrates taught concepts/skills

Consistently demonstrates concepts and skills of standard taught this quarter

<u>Usually</u> demonstrates concepts and skills of standard taught this quarter

Sometimes demonstrates concepts and skills of standard taught this quarter

1 <u>Seldom</u> demonstrates concepts and skills of standard taught this quarter




Birthday Celebrations
